

Warning to shareholders

- **Boiler room scams**

Please be aware that we have received reports that members of the public, who may also be ARM shareholders, are receiving unsolicited telephone calls from fraudulent companies, offering to buy or sell ARM shares at an attractive price relative to the market. **We suspect the calls are part of a scam and ARM would like to remind its shareholders to remain vigilant at all times.** Please see the warning below for further information.

- **General information**

Share scams are often run from "boiler rooms" where fraudsters cold-call investors offering them worthless, overpriced or even non-existent shares, or offer to buy their shares in a company at a much higher price than the market value. The "boiler room" scam has developed over recent years and there has been an increase in reports of overseas fraudsters contacting shareholders to sell and buy shares using the names, registration numbers and addresses of authorised firms and individuals in an attempt to convince consumers of their legitimacy. While they promise high returns, those who invest usually end up losing their money.

- **How to protect yourself**

- Remember: if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!
- Remain vigilant - be very wary of any unsolicited advice, or offers to buy shares at a discount.
- If you receive any unsolicited investment advice of this nature, make sure you get the correct name of the person and organisation and make a record of any other information they give you eg telephone number, address etc.
- [Check the FCA register](#) to see if the firm is authorised by the FCA.
- Report the call to the FCA by calling the FCA Consumer Helpline on 0800 111 6768 or complete the [online boiler room reporting form](#).
- Inform our Registrar, [Equiniti](#).
- If calls persist, hang up.
- You should also report suspected boiler room fraud to the police [through Action Fraud](#), which you can contact on 0300 123 2040.
