

<p>Staples, Inc.</p> <p>Corporate Political Contributions and Government Activity Disclosure Statement</p>

Staples has adopted a *Corporate Political Contributions and Government Activity Policy Statement* which sets forth basic principles that, together with Staples' Code of Ethics and its other policies and procedures, guides Staples' approach to corporate political contributions, trade associations and lobbying activities. The *Policy Statement* is available through the Staples website, www.staples.com.

As indicated in the *Policy Statement*, Staples will make available on its website an annual report for the most recent fiscal year of political contributions, certain amounts paid to trade associations and all amounts paid for lobbying activities. Corporate political contributions in the United States are also reported to, and available at, the appropriate government agencies.

Political Contributions

For the fiscal year ended January 30, 2016, Staples made the following monetary political contributions using corporate funds to candidates, political parties, political committees and other political entities organized and operating under 26 U.S.C. Section 527:

Trade Associations

Staples discloses the trade associations to which it pays annual dues of \$10,000 or more. Staples has been informed by these trade associations that a portion of such dues are used for lobbying or political contributions that if made directly by Staples would not be deductible under Section 162 (e)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code. Below is a list of the trade associations and such non-deductible amounts for the fiscal year ended January 30, 2016.
